





Educate, Medicate and Incarcerate 2013-B Proposed - HB 2 General Fund





DPHHS 2013 Biennium Budget - HB 2





Fish Wildlife and Parks 2013 Biennium Budget - HB 2










Ending Fund Balance Projections: Average Underestimated Error of \$308 million




Historically Underestimate Revenue

HJR 2 Biennial Recommendation as of November Prior to Legislative Session





Comparison of Global Insight Baseline and Moody's Analytics Forecasts Total Montana Personal Income




Use of Moody's baseline variables for Personal Income Tax, Corporate Tax and Oil & Gas taxes would add \$60 to \$90 Million for the three year period.





Most states have addressed or still face gaps in their budgets, while tax revenue declined.



New Jersey (Christ), Indiana (Daniels) and Minnesota (Pawlenty), among others, have trimmed *state* spending by sending less money to *local* governments.










<u>Teach Montana Fund</u> (State Special Revenue Fund)



 2009 proposed \$43 million one-time stimulus funds for TRS. (HB 645)

Result: Failed to pass Legislature

 2007 proposed \$100 million one-time funds to TRS. (HB 63)

Result: Only \$50 million passed Legislature. Increased TRS supplemental employer rate share to 2.11% for 2009B and 2.49% in 2011B. (\$33 Million general fund in 2011B)


• 2007 increased employer contribution rate for MPERA retirement systems. (HB 131)

Result: Passed.

2005 appropriated \$100 million to TRS and \$25 million to PERS.
