Purpose:

Several studies and analyses examining the definition of a quality education have occurred since the ratification of the 1972 Montana Constitution. The most recent of which was a private effort conducted by Augenblick and Myers. As a state sponsored commission attempts to define quality, a comprehensive definition should utilize not only the most recent attempt but the strengths of every past product as well.

Process:

- 1. Review the 1975 Basic Quality Education Report to examine and answer any questions about the study.
- 2. Identify the many individual components of Augenblick and Myers Montana study. Upon identification, examine and answer any questions about the study.
- 3. Review several other past studies and identify issues not included in the studies.
- 4. Identify the strengths of each document, ie: concepts (1975) and details (A&M), funding changes (2001 and 1988 Governor's Studies). Also find areas of improvement that aren't included in a study.
- 5. Analyze differences between studies and current system.
- 6. Utilize all analysis to develop single document outlining quality schools.
