
Job 1: Increasing Educational Attainment in Montana

Young Adult Degree Attainment, 2008

Ages 25-34 with Associate's Degree or Higher



- Montana, as well as the entire United States, trails behind leading nations in the percentage of young adults with a higher education credential.
- In order to keep pace with leading nations, the U.S. must produce 16 million more degree recipients above its projected output (48 million) by 2025.


Enrollment Highlights

- Fall 2009 & Spring 2010 highest enrollment levels in MUS history
- Over 45,000 students enrolled (unduplicated headcount)
- FTE increased by more than 15% since Fall 1999, (over 6% since Fall 2008)
- 4,300 more resident student FTE served than ten years ago
- Headcount at COTs grew by more than 4,000 students over the past ten years
